- Why methodology is important?
 - 1. Verified the credibility of our research finding
 - 2. To explain how we approach/answer to our research problem/research gap introduced in the previous section in our manuscript
 - 3. let others replicate our research and let the readers know how we achieve our result

- Which tense to be used in writing methodology?
 - Past tense because at the time we write our article we have conduct the methodology
 - 2. The usage of active or passive voice depends on the type of research we are doing
 - 3. Passive voice can be used to emphasized the method we used rather than the person.

- How to introduce methods that were used?
 - 1. Start by introducing how we approach/answer research problem. Such as qualitative or quantitative approach

- Linking instruments/analysis/techniques used
 - 1. The priority is to think based on the readers; perspective, what is the simplest way for our reader to understand our methodology
 - 2. By addressing the bigger picture of our research, starting with our research approach, how we collect the data and discuss the nature of the data.

- Sampling. Why is it important?
 - Give the validity of our result and tell to what extend our result is generalizable
 - 2. However, some of the research do not use the term 'sampling' but explain how we select the respondent.

- How to establish the methodological connection?
 - 1. First explain the research approach
 - 2. Method of data collection
 - 3. Method of data analysis
 - 4. Limitation of our research

- Limitations of the research. Do we need to?
 - 1. Give the credibility/validity of our research finding since some activities we can not do or impossible to be done
 - 2. To explain the step we have took to address or minimize the drawback in our methodology

- Areas where most researchers struggle/ potential solutions to be discussed within in the group
 - 1. Ethical matters/approval.
 - Some high impact journal will definitely ask for ethical approval
 - It is also depends on the journal. Some journal, especially related to psychology, the procedure for ethical approval is a very strict.
 - some journal accept a vary kind of ethical approval.
 - 2. Use lot of irrelevant detail information
 - 3. Rarely explain how the methodology relevant to our research
